- Medication Administration Training (MAT) The New York State Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) has specific regulations about giving medication to children in child day care settings. The regulations require all child day care programs that choose to administer medication, other than over-the-counter topical ointments, sunscreen and topically applied insect repellent, to meet certain conditions including having staff who are approved to give medication in a child care setting.
- <u>ECETP E-Learning Courses</u> OCFS offers online training using several unique and innovative delivery methods to meet the needs of child care providers throughout New York State.

Scholarships, Grants and Rebates

<u>SUNY Professional Development Program</u> - Education Incentive Program (EIP) The education program (EIP) is a scholarship program funded by New York State Office of Children and Family Services (NYS OFCS). Its purpose is assist child care providers in paying for the professional development training and education they need to provide quality care to children.

<u>The MAT Rebate Program</u> - MAT Rebate program is for day care facilities to offset the cost of the training to certify staff administer medication in a child care setting

<u>Voice CSEA</u> - Provides grant up to \$500 to New York State registered family and licensed group family child care providers outside of New York City. The grants may be used to purchase items you need to provide quality child care and Development Training and infant Child CPR First Aid Training.
